Palacios goes to the birds with first annual Matagorda Bay BirdFest this weekend

Palacios will host the first ever Matagorda Bay BirdFest, a birding festival, with activities to attract all ages and interests this Sat. & Sun. (Feb. 18 - 19).

Local organizers of the festival came up with the idea of the festival to recognize and celebrate the huge number of bird species that live in Matagorda County in the winter. What many people don't know is that Matagorda County almost always has the record for the highest number of bird species counted in the nationwide annual Christmas Bird Counts conducted by

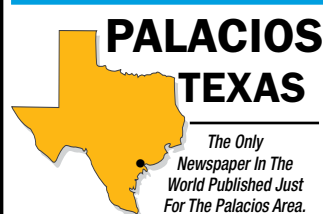
Audubon.

Many of the festival activities will take place at the Texas Baptist Encampment on the waterfront in Palacios. The festival will feature two days of activities. On Saturday, the 18th of February, the day will begin with two separate sessions: one for children and the other for adults. Friday deadline to file for PISD, City elections

This Fri. (Feb. 17) is the deadline to file for a place on the ballot in either the Palacios City Council or Palacios Independent School District Board of Trustees elections in May.

While there is yet to be a contested race for a seat at the PISD Trustee table, there is now enough candidates to

fill the vacancies as Lisa Harrison tossed her name into the hat for the Pos. 5, vacated by longtime Trustee Rick Cink.

She joins incumbents in Pos. 6 and 7, Fabian Marroquin and Peter Zamarripa, as the lone willing citizens thus far to file the necessary paperwork.

The City side remains the same with the lone contested

Seawall Commission projects continue, hear from Serendipity

The Matagorda County Seawall Commission met last week to discuss ongoing projects and view a presentation from Serendipity RV Park's Doug Jensen.

As for the Seawall repairs in regards to the East Bayshore Stress Wall Project a test section was installed on Feb. 7 in an area and the process and applicator impressed those in attendance. However, the commissioners are not convinced this is the best way to repair the problem so they authorized some more digging and exploration to fully determine the best way to correct the erosion occurring in and behind the joints. The best way may be to excavate behind the wall and replace the back under compaction after the repairs are made. This winter is almost over for low tide repairs to be done considering the time line required for advertising

and bidding the job. With time not being favorable, the

While construction nears completion, Pavilion still in need of donations

About twenty-five years ago, Roberta Ripke had a dream of building a new Pavilion to replace the tattered remains of the landmark in Palacios. Upon her death in 2012, the torch was passed, and the Palacios Beautification and Pavilion Committee members are standing just inches away from the goal line in seeing her dream come to fruition.

Prior to the groundbreaking last year there was great momentum for the project, with promises of donations from an array of sources. These donations, in addition to a Coastal Impact Assistance Program (CIAP) grant,

were to fully fund the new Pavilion, but momentum waned as construction dragged on, and took many of the stakeholders with it.

As of last month's Pavilion Committee meeting, there was \$124,000 in the bank and two disbursements to be made totaling approximately \$112,000, so, you do the math.

According to Treasurer, Debbie Morris, the bank account is virtually empty, and with construction expected to be completed in less than a month, give or take some extra time for 'punch-list' items, it's crunch time!

At this time, the shortfall in funding is approximately \$500,000, with the bulk of that owed to the general contractor, Charnock &
