

## **Council extends City Manager thru 2030**

The City of Palacios now has its lead lady at the helm thru 2023 after a contract extension for City Manager Cindy Raleigh was approved at last week's regular City Council meeting.

Following a brief stay behind executive session's closed doors, a motion was made by Councilwoman Donna Schulman. "I move to extend the City Manager's contract by an additional three years, with a new expiration date of October 2030, in recognition of the foundational work achieved in building a cohesive team, setting project priorities, securing funding, and fostering strong relation-

ships with management, staff, council and the community. This extension supports continuity and stability for Palacios' future growth and development."

Council, minus members Joe Ramirez and Raylynn Samora, approved the extension, 5-0.

#### **Forced water meter** installation ordinance tabled

A proposed ordinance to require water meter installations with base monthly utility charges on all vacant lots within the City of Palacios was tabled.

There was general consensus among Council and city personnel, that further information and exploration of the water meter matter, would be prudent.

### **Grant Update**

An impressive October 2024 update report was presented to Council via HR/Grant Manager Tammy McDonald outlining numerous pending grant applications and those currently processed. At this time the City is administering 15 grants which include funding for coastal resiliency, police department overtime, police officers, police gear wear cameras and bulletproof vests, water mains, airport maintenance, comprehensive plans for roads and sidewalks, animal control and park improvements.

The City has recent grant applications for waterlines, drainage, park upgrades, a community hub center, that could be used as a shelter.

'In the next two (2) months, we are going to be applying for sidewalks, ADA ramps, lighting, waterline replacements, park im-provements and more," McDonald said. "The application for an EPA Community Change grant is for the hyper shelter, the plan being, to partner with the YMCA for the use of the facility on a daily basis, and in the event of a disaster, the building would be used as a community shelter. It would have a kitchen, showers and everything needed to shelter during emergencies....with the last hurricane, Beryl, we realized that we have no place to put anyone during a hurricane or disaster, here. That was a big deal for us-we didn't even have
