# PISD Trustees tap Scantlen for Finance Director

The Palacios ISD School Board meeting began last Thursday by recognizing so many talented students who have recently received awards and recognition for various reasons: art contest winners, UIL placements, both boy and girl basketball athletes, power lifting athletes and US history scholars. Teachers and principals beamed during the students introductions and board members smiled with great pride for all of their students accomplishments, including some of their very own children, were among those recognized.

**Superintendent Report** 

Dr. Jared Duncum, Superintendent of PISD shared his recent productive trip to Austin for Matagorda Day where he was able to talk to representatives, senators and chief of staff. Dr. Duncum indicated there's a lot going on in the legislative session, much of which is detailed in his emailed Legislative Update to staff and interested

Dr. Duncum encouraged the community to call representatives and advocate for PISD and President Karen Botbyl encouraged all to "tell our story" to request this Weekly Legislative Update email from Dr. Duncum to know what is going on in the

legislature.
"We do not tell people enough, in

public education and Palacios in general, all the amazing things the students of Palacios are doing.

**Technology Replacement Plan** 

There were two options of the technology cyclical replacement plan, instead of purchasing 1600 new chrome books all at once due to the significant cost, which was presented by Dr. Duncum. Ideally PISD would house 1,600 Chrome Books, with 300 to have as spares. Option one was to maintain the technology cyclical replacement plan in house, purchasing 250 chrome books at a time to replace outdated or damaged technology, however Dr. Duncum shared this option lacks long-term pricing security and the potential increase of cost due to inflation and/or tariffs.

The second option presented was leasing from a third-party provider, offering stability in pricing and the ability to budget accordingly. This lease option also provides a buy-back program for existing dated Chrome Books.

Board president Karen Botbyl motioned to approve option 2, leasing new Chome Books for all of PISD, but only had board members Becky Aguleria and Haley Garcia's support. Board members Brandon Bowers and Carl Filip were against leasing but would rather set aside an allotted amount each year for the anticipated

# Sales Tax Holiday for Emergency Supplies this Sat. - Mon.

(AUSTIN) — As severe weather season approaches, Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar reminds Texans they can purchase certain items tax free during the state's sales tax holiday for emergency preparation supplies, which begins at 12:01 a.m. on Saturday, April 26, and ends at midnight on Monday, April 28.

The Comptroller's office estimates shoppers will save about \$2.3 million in state and local sales taxes during the tax holiday, which was approved by the Texas Legislature in 2015.

There's no limit on the number of qualifying items you can purchase. These in• household batteries, fuel containers

and flashlights priced less than \$75; hurricane shutters and emergency

ladders priced less than \$300; and

• portable generators priced less than

For purchases made online, note that delivery, shipping, handling and transportation charges are part of the sales price. If the emergency preparation supply being purchased is taxable, the delivery charge is also taxable. Consider these charges when determining whether an item can be purchased tax free during

For example, if you purchase an emer-

gency ladder online for \$299 with a \$10 delivery charge, the total sales price is \$309. Because the total sales price of the emergency ladder is more than \$300, tax

is due on the \$309 sales price. Purchases that do not qualify include:

 batteries for automobiles, boats and other motorized vehicles; camping stoves and camping supplies; chainsaws; plywood; extension ladders and stepladders;

A complete list of emergency preparation supplies that may be purchased tax free can be found on the Comptroller's website.
